Dear authors, thank you for your thorough revision. I believe that the manuscript has been improved significantly and I have no further content-related comments. I only observed that years for references do not match between text and reference list, such as for Birkel et al.

Additional Questions:

- 1. Originality: Does the paper contain new and significant information adequate to justify publication?: Yes.
